Club Information Sheet

Thank you for your interest in our Club. We are a 100% NRA affiliated Club of over 1,500 members. Our range is open to its members seven days a week from 8AM til sun sets behind berms. The range consists of approximately 100 acres that is owned by the Club. We have concrete, covered firing lines at most of our ranges. Our ranges are bermed and/or baffled for sound abatement as necessary. Our ranges include but are not limited to:

General Safety Rules Summary

- Always point the muzzle in a safe direction (loaded or unloaded)
- Always keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot
- Always keep your firearm unloaded until ready to use
- Always know your target and what is beyond
- Always wear eye and ear protection while on an active firing line
- When entering the property, your firearm **MUST** be unloaded
- When entering the property, your firearm must be:
 - Encased Firearm: Encased Firearm May Be Moved, Range HOT or COLD
Encased Means Trigger Protected: Case, Rug, Holster, Slip
ALL PISTOLS MUST BE ENCASED
 - Un-Cased Long Guns: May Move To or From Vehicle While Range HOT ONLY
Require Visible Empty Chamber Indicator Installed
Transport Safe Direction; Do Not Point at Human
- Cold Range:
 - **ABSOLUTELY** No Handling of Firearms While Range is COLD
 - All Firearms Unloaded, Magazines Out, Actions Open, **On Bench**
 - DO NOT Put In Case or Install Empty Chamber Indicator While Range is COLD
 - DO NOT Remove from Case or Remove Empty Chamber Indicator While Range is COLD
- Before making the firing line 'HOT', all persons must be behind the firing line
 - Do not handle firearm while anyone is forward of the firing line
- Hot Range:
 - Muzzle Always Pointed Down Range, Bullets Must Impact Berm / Trap
 - Muzzle Down Range When Loading / Unloading
 - Muzzle Down Range When Casing / Installing Empty Chamber Indicator
 - Muzzle Down Range When Un-Casing / Removing Empty Chamber Indicator
 - Muzzle Down Range When Inspecting or Discussing Firearm
- Obey 'ALL' firing line commands
 - COLD Range – Unload, Mag Out, Action Open, DO NOT TOUCH
 - HOT Range – Case, UnCase, Safely Load and Fire
 - "CEASE FIRE" – Stop shooting, Safety 'ON', Determine Problem
 - Remember, Visual and Verbal Contact, all have on hearing protection
 - Move Forward of Firing line ONLY on a 'COLD' range
- Follow all rules and commands of specified Range Officers
 - Scheduled or Organized activities will have designated Range Officer
 - Some of the above rules may vary with designated Range Officer present
 - If sharing a range with an event, check with Range Officer first

General Range Regulations Summary

- Speed Limit is 10 mph, speeding will result in you having to park at gate and walk in
- Members must visibly display membership badges except during working parties
- Members may not lend keys or badges
- Members are responsible for their guests and have direct control of guest at all times
- Guests are limited to **3** ea at one time, non-family members limited to **4** times a year
- When any guest is firing, you must supervise them and you may **not** shoot
- When you are firing, the guests may **not** shoot
- The same rules apply to minor children (under 18)
- Targets placed on PMRPC provided target frames / backers only, no impromptu targets
- Ground level targets, cross-firing or ricochets are not allowed.
- Firearms are to be used only on the designated ranges, at designated targets with safe ammo
- Conform to all specific rules posted on each range
- No alcoholic beverages will be allowed on, behind or adjacent to any range while shooting is in progress
- The executive board must approve scheduling or re-scheduling of any matches or activities
- The executive board must approve installation or changes of any rules, fixtures, target stands or backstops
- No commercial or private activities allowed unless approved by Executive Board



Membership Application Process

Membership is a three step process:

1. The applicant **must** attend Range Safety and Orientation Class held on the 4th Saturday of each month at noon (12:00 PM) at the range. Duration less than 3 hours. No exceptions to attending orientation. You will be required to shoot (normally pistol), and may bring your own gun (eye and ear protection also, if you have them), we will provide if you wish.
2. **Receive Application Form at Orientation.** Complete and sign application, sign Hold Harmless Agreement, submit all fees and dues (check or money order) during orientation or mail in after orientation, your choice. Will need Drivers License Number and NRA Number. If not NRA Member, we can sign you up. You must be a NRA Member since we are a 100% NRA Club.
3. After steps 1 and 2 are fully completed, the application is presented to the Board of Directors. Upon review and approval by the Board, a club identification badge and key will be mailed to you.

Regular Membership Requirements

Any citizen of the United States 18 years of age or over who is or will become a member of the NRA may become a member of this organization by vote of the Executive Committee after subscribing to the following pledge and upon payment of the usual initiation fees and dues. Life Membership is also available.

I certify that I am a citizen of the United States of America and that I am not a member of any organization or group, which has any part of its program the attempt to overthrow the Government of the United States or any of its political subdivisions by force or violence; that I have never been convicted of a crime of violence, and if admitted to membership I will endeavor to fulfill the obligations of good sportsmanship and good citizenship.

All regular full members must maintain NRA membership during the course of their membership in the Club.

A **non-citizen** may be granted all membership rights and privileges provided that all the below qualifications are met.

The applicant subscribes to and wholeheartedly endorses the principle of the text of the above pledge.

The applicant is an NRA member, or is eligible and will become an NRA member.

The application is accompanied by payment in full of the applicable initiation fees and dues.

The application is approved by the Executive Committee.

The application is approved by two-thirds of the members present at a monthly Club meeting.

Associate Membership . Associate Member is granted to relatives living in the same household as a Full or Life Club Member or as otherwise granted by the Executive Board. An associate member shall not be eligible to vote on Club issues or in Club elections. The rights, privileges, and responsibilities of an associate member shall be regulated by the Executive Committee. Associate Member **must** attend orientation and submit application at that time. Associate Member under 18 years of age does not receive a Gate Key.

Yearly Dues

Club year runs from June 1 to June 1. Dues are \$100 for full members and \$35 for associate members per year. The \$200 Initiation Fee is a one time fee the first year. Each year a new sticker for your badge is mail to you upon receipt of that years dues. Attach the sticker to your badge as soon as you get it. It is the guards/members way of telling if you are a current member while on property. Any member with unpaid dues by July 1st will be denied access to the property until current membership is obtained.

Fee Breakdown

The fees listed below include **\$200 one time initiation fee**, yearly dues pro-rated by month for the current year. If joining in March or April, you will be paying for the remainder of the current year and the next full year.

Full Member **must** be an NRA Member, if not an NRA Member you may join for an additional \$35.00. Associate Members are not required to be NRA Members, but are encouraged to join.

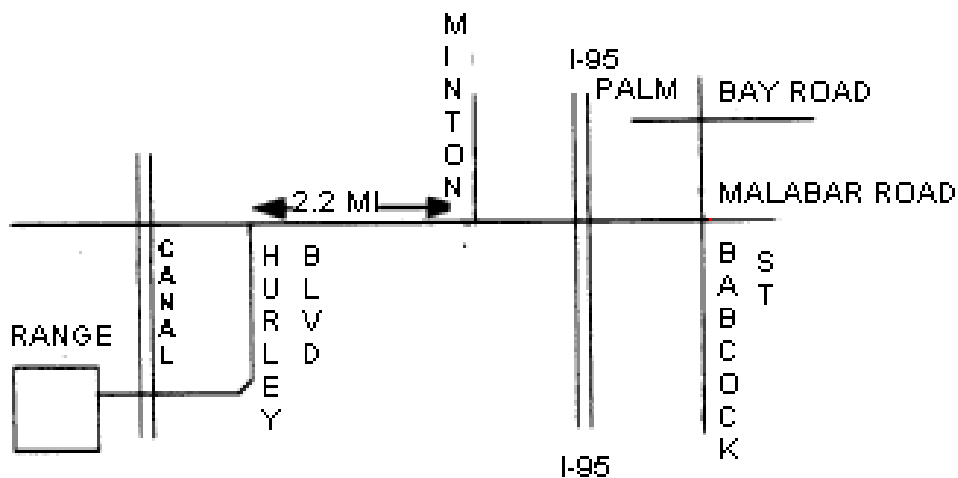
